## **II. MAJOR PHYSICAL TARGETS & ACHIEVEMENTS**

- a) The Archaeology Deptt. maintained monuments in Delhi Golf Area and many other places and Museums at Mirza Ghalib's Haveli and Dara Shikoh Library at Kashmere Gate. The department has also made extensive renovations at Kudsia Bagh near ISBT.
- b) Enactment of Delhi Ancient & Historical Monuments & Archaeological Sites & Remains Act-2004' was enacted w.e.f. 7-9-2005.  
Prepared and submitted rules for implementation of aforesaid Act to Law Deptt. Prepared preliminary reports on excavation conducted at Bhorgarh and Mandoli.
- c) The Archives Department started massive work of digitalization of all old records, papers, photos etc. available in its Archives.
- d) Sahitya Kala Parishad organized various programmes of fine art, music, dance & drama all over Delhi.
- e) The Distt. Cultural Centre at Janak Puri was made functional. Land at Hastal was also purchased for Construction of Multipurpose Centre.
- f) The five Languages Academies organized work-shops, Kavi Sammelans, Mushairas, Competitions, Poet meets, Seminars and other literary programmes. All these five Academies also participated in Book Fairs. Punjabi, Urdu and Sanskrit Academies also run respective language teaching Programmes in Govt. Schools.
- g) Sindhi Academy organized Indo Pak Sindhi Mahotsava for literary and cultural exchange between the two countries.
- h) The following activities and functions were organized by the Hindi Academy during 2005-06.:
  - (i) 2376 students were given the Chhatra Pratibha Puraskar.

- (ii) 400 prizes were given to the participants in the Note, Poems, Stories and One Act play competitions and writers in Ansu Lekhan Pratiyogita.
- (iii) 45 prizes were given to the Navodit Lekhak.
- (iv) 30 Teachers were honoured on Hindi Teachers Day.
- (v) 100 programmes were organized under Bhagidari Scheme.

### **III REASONS FOR SHORTFALL**

1. Archeology Department reported shortfalls mainly due to non receipt of project report from INTACH for establishment of Museum at Qudasia Garden, non finalization of concept of interpretation centre at Mehrauli and Non-finalization of estimates for conservation of monuments and drawing for renovation and up-gradation of Archaeological Museum.
2. Shortfall under SKP was attributed mainly due to non allotment of Land for district culture center Ashok Vihar, non implementation of Parishad Rang mandal scheme due to some administrative reasons, non receipt of demand of fund from concerned NGO under Asian Film Festival scheme etc.
3. Non conducting of Iftar Party and other few programmes by Urdu Academy.
