

XVIII. SPORTS AND YOUTH SERVICES

The schemes under this sector envisage promotion of sports and youth welfare programmes in Delhi. Facilities for promotion of sports and youth services are being provided by constructing sports complexes, stadium, swimming pools, development of play-grounds and youth hostels and arranging youth welfare programmes etc.

Financial Outlays and Expenditures

Agency-wise details for 9th Five Year Plan, 10th Five Year Plan 2002-07 and Annual Plan 2000-03 are indicated in the following table: -

Department and scheme wise details of schemes included in Annual Plan 2001-2002 are given in following paragraphs.

I. DIRECTORATE OF EDUCATION

1. Promotion of Sports & Games Activities

(Rs.900.00 lacs for 10th Plan) (Rs.170.00 lacs for Annual Plan 2002-03)

This ongoing scheme aims at promotion and improvement of sports & games in Delhi by providing opportunities and facilities to the young and talented players to learn,

train and improve their standard in sports & games upto the National and International, Asian and Olympic level. Under the scheme various regular activities / programmes, coaching camps and other national and state level tournaments are being organised. The scheme also provide for participation of National School Games, purchase of playing kits, and sports material, salary for staff etc.

Physical education is important for all-round development and improvement of health and mental facilities of individuals. Sports & Games help in producing healthy, mentally alert and confident citizens.

The details of the activities / programmes /tournaments proposed to be conducted are as follows: -

1. Sports Talent Search Meet in different sports disciplines.
2. Summer sports Meet in different disciplines.
3. Organisation of All India Rajiv Gandhi Gold Cup Tournament in various disciplines.
4. Organisation of Distt. & Inter Distt. Tournaments.
5. Women Sports festivals/activities.
6. All India Rural Sports competitions including Block level and Inter-block level tournaments.
7. Organisation of Pre-Subroto football tournaments and Nehru Hockey tournaments.
8. Participation of Delhi School Teams in National School Games.
9. Organisation of National School Games in Delhi.
10. Organisation of All India Civil Services tournament.
11. Purchase of sports materials for coaching centres/camps and schools.
12. To provide playing kit and other essential items to the players/participants.
13. To conduct regular coaching camps round the year and selection of the teams for the National and International tournaments and participation therein.

The following activities/programmes are proposed to be conducted :-

1. Organisation of Invitational tournaments including International and participation in National/International tournaments.
2. To organise sports competitions in every constituency like country Races-one Major and Minor Games.
3. To organise sports competitions at micro level of the school students of Education Department.
4. To purchase Jeep/Matador Vehicles for sports branches.
5. To bring out a Magazine.
6. Staff for various schemes.
7. Other misc. and unforeseen emergent events and expenditure for them such as stationary, medicines, medical aid etc.
8. Provision for transport charges, refreshment during coaching period is also made.

At present the coaching is provided with borrowed coaches from SAI, part-time coaches and to some extent by various PET's from school. The following additional staff are required for strengthening the sports programmes at grass root level :-

In order to achieve best results, the players who have been selected for National School Games and whose performance is within 95% range of National Records of the last year, will be provided with Special Diet @ Rs.100/- per day per head for 21

day of Coaching camp prior to National School Games. This scheme will initially be started for three disciplines viz. Athletics, Swimming and Lawn Tennis for the children of three age group i.e. under 14, under 17 and under 19 (Boys & Girls) . Every year around 85 players are selected for Swimming , 70 players for Athletics and 20 players for Lawn Tennis. Only 20 players in each discipline shall be assisted under the programme.

Special coaching facility shall also be provided to 20 top players selected through a Committee in athletics and swimming and 10 players from lawn tennis. Financial assistance @ Rs.25/- per day for athletics, Rs.200/- per day for swimming and Rs.500/- per day for lawn tennis for 3 months shall be paid under the scheme.

**2. DEVELOPMENT OF PLAY GROUNDS, SPORTS COMPLEX, SWIMMING POOLS, GYMNASIUM HALLS ETC.,
(Rs.400.00 lacs for 10th Plan) (Rs.80.00 lacs for Annual Plan 2002-03)**

The scheme aims at development of play grounds, construction of swimming pools, gymnasium halls for providing sport complexes effective and adequate facilities to the young talented players of Delhi.

It is proposed that the participation in games will be made compulsory in all the schools for children of Delhi and due consideration will be given to his/her performance in the sports for promoting him/her to the next higher class. Under the scheme the schools will be provided with necessary sports material and material for maintenance.

These facilities will be developed in the existing schools where there is a large hunk of land available for the development of such fields. Such schools will be provided with the facilities in respect of the game under the recognized games of schools Games

Federation of India. The facilities will be included providing change room, toilets, office complex etc. for boys and girls separately.

Moreover presently Directorate of Education has 11 Swimming Pools located in different schools which are opened to the school children. Swimming is one of the sports which is developing in Delhi at a very rapid pace. The existing swimming facilities available to the general public are inadequate besides being very expensive. A common man can hardly afford to have the existing swimming facilities. This fact is not allowing the undiscovered talent and the young swimmers which might be hidden. Hon'ble L.G. emphasized the need for opening the existing facilities in sports stadia run by Directorate of Education to general public so as to improve the standards of sports and also to make available sports facilities to common man. For this purpose, 4 sports stadia namely Chhatarsal Stadium, Tyagraj Stadium, Singhu Border and Ludlow Castle Stadia have been identified.

To achieve this objective mentioned above, it is also proposed to allow existing swimming pool to the general public for which adequate membership fee will be prescribed. Besides earning revenue to the Department as mentioned above, this will also be beneficial in increasing participation of public in swimming and improving the general standards of sports.

Approved Outlay for 2002-03 – Rs.90.00 Lacs (10® + 70 ©).

Approved Outlay for 10th Plan Rs.450.00 Lacs. (50 ® + 400 ©).

3. Establishment of Rural Sports Stadia

(Rs.175.00 lakhs for 10th Plan)

(Rs.35.00 lakhs for Annual Plan 2002-03)

Under this scheme it is proposed to construct sports stadium, sport centers and to provide proper coaching facilities to the student of rural area to promote sports in villages.

It is also proposed to construct sports stadium / complexes in rural block of Delhi. There is a scheme to promote sports in villages in collaboration with SAI. But the number of participants are negligible in the absence of proper staff and organisers.

Most of the national players are from rural areas. But in Delhi it has been completely neglected. The following facilities are proposed to be provided in rural areas.

- (i) Special coaching.
- (ii) Development of playgrounds in each school of rural area.
- (iii) Provision of Sports materials.
- (iv) Regular sports complex in rural area.
- (v) Development of one coaching center in each rural school and one center in each village.

Approved OUTLAY for 2002-03 Rs.35.00 Lacs (10® + 25©).

Approved OUTLAY for 10th Plan Rs.175.00 Lacs. (50® + 125 ©)

4. Youth Welfare Programmes

(Rs.125.00 lakhs for 10th Plan) (Rs.25.00 lakhs for Annual Plan 2002-03)

This continuing scheme envisages to inculcate the sprit of adventure, self-confidence amongst the youth of Delhi particularly school students and give them opportunities to interact and understand each others culture.

To achieve this objective, following programmes are conducted: -

1. Trekking, Rock-climbing and Mountaineering programmes.
2. To hold seminars/ Youth festivals.
3. To purchase furniture and Jeep for Youths Hostels.
4. Winter and water games.

It is proposed to construct Youth Hostel at Chhatrasal Stadium, Model town, Tikri Khurd, Tuglakabad, Tyagraj Nagar, Srinivasapuri and Singhu.

Approved outlay for 2002-03 Rs. 25.00 lacs & approved outlay for 10th Plan – Rs. 125.00 lacs.

5. Establishment of Delhi School of sports

(Rs.810.00 lakhs for 10th Plan)

(Rs.150.00 lakhs for Annual Plan 2002-03)

At present there are 1218 government and govt. aided schools in NCT of Delhi, Govt. of Delhi is also making all efforts to make sports one of the compulsory subject and there are improvement in the participation of Delhi school students in school games at state level as well as the national level. It has been felt from a long time that Delhi must have its own school of sports. It may not be out of place to mention that in state like Orissa every district has one sports school. The aim and objective are as under: -

- i) To improve general education with emphasis on sports.
- ii) To provide facilities for all round development of children.
- iii) To create awareness about different disciplines of sports and provide suitable environment to choose one of his /her discipline.
- iv) To provide facilities to excel in the chosen sport discipline.

Land measuring 90 acres costing Rs. 1170 lacs has been acquired at Ghevra Mor for Delhi School of Sports. The entire cost of land has been paid. The work of construction of boundary wall on this land has been taken up by PWD. During the year 2002-03 the work on the building will be initiated.

To start a sports school of international level, a proper project report has to be prepared. This is otherwise/essential so that the facilities/courses proposed to be provided/introduced in that school are of a very high standard and meet the necessary requirements. It is, therefore, proposed to appoint a Consultant of national/international repute to prepare a project report.

For construction of boundary wall, a provision of Rs.1.85 crores has already been made and sanction for which has been accorded during the 2001-02 year and a sum of Rs.40 lakhs has already been made available to PWD. However, this amount has not

been spent by PWD on account of ongoing litigation in Delhi High Court related with about 25 acres of land, possession of which has not yet been handed over to the Directorate of Education. In the recent meeting convened by Secretary (Education), it is agreed that Chowkidar hut may also be constructed and possibilities of interchange of land and of constructing the other entry points for the proposed school may be explored.

An outlay of Rs.810.00 lacs has been approved for 10th Five Year Plan and Rs.150.00 lacs for Annual Plan 2002-03 which includes Rs.148.00 lacs under capital head.

6. Construction of Wrestling Stadia

(Rs.370.00 lacs for 10th Plan)

(Rs.30.00 lacs of Annual Plan 2002-03)

To provide wrestlers of national and international standards, proper infrastructure is a must. Wrestling is a proper sports in rural areas, but they suffer in the national and international area because of lack of training to use the latest infrastructure. As they are not exposed to such devices during training, so there is a need to provide wrestling stadium equipped with latest infrastructural facilities to develop the sport. One such wrestling stadia will be developed in Pehladpur.

Aim and objectives of the scheme are: -

- i) To maintain physical fitness of children.
- ii) To provide scientific training by the expert coach.
- iii) To produce wrestlers of national and international level by providing them latest know how and equipment facilities such as balanced diet and medical facilities.

Children in the age group of 6-16 years will be considered. To begin with approx. 50 students per year will be trained.

1. Approved Outlay for 2002-03 Rs.30.00 lacs (1® + 29©.)
2. Approved Outlay for 10th Plan Rs.370.00 lacs.

7. Establishment of Sports Centers

(Rs.60.00 lakhs for 10th Plan) (Rs.12.00 lakhs for Annual Plan 2002-03)

The population explosion in Delhi has created a lot of health hazards, the forests and the open areas have shrunk, leaving the people with no space to use as playgrounds etc. Though the govt. of Delhi is making efforts for planned development of the city yet some sports centers are required for the up keep of the health of the citizens of Delhi. To start with one sports center is required to be established in each Assembly Constituency.

The Aim and objective of the scheme are: -

- i) To create awareness about the maintenance of good health amongst citizens to keep them physically and mentally fit.
- ii) To given the senior citizens an opportunity to maintain their health.

These centers will function in big parks maintained by MCD or DDA or where the park is not available, and open space available which will be identified by the MLA or residents welfare association of the area. It is proposed that one per-fab room in each such center will be constructed where equipments will be kept and chowkidar will be appointed and the chowkidar will be responsible for the safety of the equipments. Part time instructors for Yoga, wrestling and weight lifting etc. will be provided. These centers will be run in the morning and evening. The sports material and staff for running these sports centres will be provided by the Sports Branch.

1. Approved Outlay for 2002-03 Rs.12.00 lacs (10[®] + 2[©]).
2. Approved Outlay for 10th Plan Rs.60.00 lacs.

6. Special Assistance to the out standing players / Sportsmen and Rajiv Gandhi Sports Awards

(Rs.100.00 lakhs for 10th Plan)

(Rs.20.00 lakhs for Annual Plan 2002-03)

- (i) Special Assistance to Outstanding Players**

It has been observed that time and again most states confer cash awards to the outstanding players /sports man belonging to their state, who participated in the various sports competition and win laurel for the state, in the national and international level. It is therefore envisaged the Delhi govt. should also start conferring awards to such to players and sports man on the same lines as indicated by ht govt. of India in the scheme of Special. Awards to winner of international sports events.

The amount of the special awards under para-1 above, is given in the table.

Team Events

Team events are the events where competition is among the teams, each team has more than one person as members. The amount of special award will be determined as under: -

The sportsmen/ players should be a bonafide resident of Delhi at the time of taking part in such competitions i.e. National/International.

An eligible sportsman/ player would be awarded only once in a year for a single discipline subject to maximum of Rs. 5 lacs only. If a player has obtained merit in a single item of sports conducted by more than once agency on different occasions in a year, his/her case for conferring award would be consider on the basis of the top most position obtained by him/her among the certificates issued by the agencies concerned but he will be rewarded for that position only and not for other position achieved by him/her.

If the sportsperson/player has been given assistance three times in previous years, his/her case shall be considered only, if he/she has established a new National/International record in the year for which special assistance is to be given.

Beneficiaries will be identified from the results of the National and International competitions, certified by the organizing authorities of such games. The achievement of the player will also be got confirmed from the authorized association concerned game. The position holders of previous year will be awarded in current financial year in a

ceremony to be organized by the sports branch in the presence of other budding players/athletics being groomed in the schools.

The matter regarding conferring of awards shall be decided by the Selection/Experts committee, constituted for the purpose.

(ii) **RAJIV GANDHI KHEL PURSKAR**

On the pattern of Arjuna Award given every year to the outstanding sports persons of the country for excellence in various sports disciplines by the Govt. of India, it has been decided that Govt. of Delhi will also present awards to 5 outstanding sports persons in age group of 14 years and above of different discipline for promotion of sports in Delhi. The awards would be known as Rajiv Gandhi Sports Award and will carry a cash prize of Rs.2.00 lacs a citation and a memento.

This award will be given every year on 20th August i.e. on the birthday of late Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi as a mark of respect for his affection towards sports.

For a sportsperson to be considered for this award, he or she should have given outstanding performance at the National and International levels for three years prior to the year for which person is being considered for the award and in that year, in particular, the person should have achieved excellence in his or her specific discipline of sports. Besides, the sportsperson should have displayed a high sense of discipline, sportsmanship and the best quality of leadership. Entries will be invited for recognized sports federations/ associations/individuals by sports branch of the Deptt.

An outlay of Rs. 100.00 lacs has been approved for 10th Five Year Plan and Rs.20.00 lacs approved for Annual plan 2002-03 for this scheme for both parts (i) & (ii)

**9. Development of Chhatrasal Stadium Tyrag Nagr Stadium & Other Stadia.
(Rs.190.00 lakhs for 10th Plan)
(Rs.30.00 lakhs for Annual Plan 2002-03)**

This scheme envisages to develop and upkeep play fields and other facilities at Chhattarsal Stadium and Tyagraj Nagar. There is also need for the following works: -

1. Upgradation of the play fields & their maintenance.
2. Security and sanitation of the Stadia.
3. Addition of new fields.

Efforts will be made for providing synthetic running track, synthetic lawn, tennis courts construction of 50 m. swimming pool and construction of Astroturf Hockey fields. It is also proposed to provide security guards from the private firm to provide better environment for the players etc.

Programme Contents

During the 10th five year plan, the playing facilities in the present stadium and sports complex named above will be upgraded. Synthetic running track will be laid, it is also proposed to convert the existing clay lawn tennis court into synthetic lawn tennis courts. It is proposed to construct international standard all weather, swimming pool at one of the places subject to the availability of lands. One Astroturf hockey field will also be develop. It is proposed to add administrative block in the existing Chhatarsal stadium and construction of Indoor multipurpose hall with a capacity for 500 spectators.

Since there has been manifold increase in the number of grounds developed at Chhatarsal Stadium. After the establishment of Delhi legislative assembly this stadium is being used for all state function held on occasion of Republic day parade, Independence day, Mahatma Gandhi Jayanti and Children day. Moreover National school games, zonal and inter district game are held every year. This stadium is also used for public school functions.

It is proposed to open three stadia, namely Chhatrasal Stadium, Tyagaraj Stadium and Stadium at Singhu Border and the facilities available at Ludlow Castle to public on the pattern of Sports complexes run by DDA. For this purpose a meeting was convened by the Hon'ble LG on 4.11.01 and a decision to this effect has already been taken. The sports facilities available in these 4 centres/stadias, would be made available to public, which will go a long way in improving the overall standards of the sports and these steps will also be made available to the common man, access to sports facilities in these stadia, which are of quite high standards and cannot be afforded by a common man. This will also supplement the programme already undertaken by DDA.

For this purpose membership would be made available to the general public. Membership fee etc. on the pattern of DDA would be charged. Extension of these facilities to public will be organised in such a way that the existing facilities provided to the school children are not affected. Since the pressure on existing facilities would be increased substantially after the introduction of this scheme as approved by Hon'ble L.G., replacement of sports material, instruments etc. as the department will have to upgrade the existing facilities and will have also to increase and provide additional inputs, sports equipment and has to upgrade the existing facilities.

An outlay of Rs.190.00 lacs has been approved for 10th Five Year Plan and Rs.30.00 lacs approved for Annual Plan 2002-03 which includes Rs.28.00 lacs under capital head.

10. Establishment of Games Academies/ Institutes

(Rs.105.00 lakhs for 10th Plan)

(Rs.11.00 lakhs for Annual Plan 2002-03)

There has been improvement in the general policy of sports among the school students in Delhi. However, it is felt that there must be specialized academies/Institutes to provide training to the school students to excel themselves in the particular game. It is a fact that this scientific age has a value for specialization. It is proposed to establish institutes for the following individual games.

1. Wrestling
2. Athletics
3. Hockey
4. Lawn Tennis
5. Cricket
6. Archery

It is proposed that each institute will have a space for accommodation of, 100 students. The student will be studying in their normal school but will be provided hostel accommodation and sports facilities at one place.

1. Approved Outlay for 2002-03 Rs.11.00 Lacs (1.0 @ + 10.0 ©.)
2. Approved Outlay for 10th Plan Rs.105.00 Lacs. (5.0 @ + 100.0©).

11. BEST SPORTS TEACHERS AWARD

(Rs.15.00 lakhs for 10th Plan)

(Rs.2.00 lakhs for Annual Plan 2002-03)

There is a scheme for providing state award to teachers but no sports teacher so far has been given this award. To encourage the performance of the team as well as recognition of the service of a sports coach/teachers, it is proposed that best sport teacher/coach award may be institute. The award will be given to the best sports teacher/coach depending upon his performance in the National School Games. The scheme will work on a similar lines as of the state award and award of Rs.5000/- in all disciplines will be given. The detailed rules will be laid down for selection of Teachers. Details are as under:-

HEADLINES: -

1. It has been decided to confer 13 awards to outstanding sports teachers (i.e.) Coaches & P.E.T.s working at different Coaching Centers of Sports Branch & in Govt. Schools under the control of Directorate of Education, Govt. of Delhi. Every teacher will be awarded a cash price, a memento & a citation.

2. The teacher who have been awarded this award will have no right for extension in service under DSER 1973.
3. To be eligible for the award, Coach/PET should have successfully trained sports persons or teams and enabled them to achieve outstanding results in International/National Competition consistently for the previous three years. In addition to this, his performance for the year for which the award is recommended will also be taken into consideration. Besides this, he/she should have shown qualities of leadership, sportsmanship and sense of discipline.

4. ESSENTIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR THIS AWARD: -

- (a) Sports Coach should have rendered at least 5 years continuous service on any sports coaching center of Directorate.
- (b) PET should have rendered at least 5 years teaching service in any Govt. Sr. Sec. School/Sec. School/ Coaching Center.
- (c) PET should have valid NIS Certificate as coach in the concerned game (applicable for those working Coaching Centers)/or 10 years service in their field.

5. NOMINATION PROCEDURE FOR COACHES: -

- (a) The nomination of this award to a Coach and P.E.Ts working in diverted capacity at Coaching Centers, will be prepared by ADE (sports) and then it will be sent to the Office of DDE (sports) for consideration.
- (b) The nomination so received will be processed and scrutinized by Sports Branch. All such eligible cases will be put up before the Screening Committee of this Directorate formed for this purpose.

6. NOMINATION PROCEDURE FOR P.E.T.

- (a) The nomination of this award to PETs working in schools will be prepared by the concerned Vice Principle/Principle of the respective school where the said PET is posted. Then it will be sent to the office of representative district Deputy Director of Education for further necessary action.
- (b) The case with record to this award in different district will be scrutinized by a Committee consisting of the following member of the district.

- (c) The committee of the different district of the Directorate will prepare a list of the candidates in order of merit after considering and fulfilling all the details of the PETs. The list so prepared, in order of merit, will be sent to the officer of Deputy Director of Education (Sports) the list so forwarded will be supported by the nomination form and the detail record of the district committees.

It will be in shot by the Reporting Officer that all the columns contained in the application form of this award have been field correctly and the information furnished in it is true and correct. It is also necessary that the photocopies attached with the application form should be got attested by a Gazetted Officer and duly certified by Reporting Officer. Vigilance Clearance Report of the concerned Coach/PET will be furnished by the office of DDA(sports)/ Distt. DDE respectively.

Application forms selected by DDE (sports) District of the Doctorate will be finally scrutinized by a Screening Committee to be setup for the purpose by the Director of Education. The entire process for this Committee will be carried out by the Sports Branch.

Keeping in mind the above distribution, the conferring of award will be restricted to the award per discipline every year.

No award will be made for a second time to the same person in the succeeding three years after the year in which he/she has been conferred with this award.

The award may be given posthumously if such an occasion arises.

BASIC OF SELECTION: -

- (i) All the nomination forms, so selected will be put up before the Screening Committee formed for this purpose. The Screening Committee will scrutinize the cases and arrange them in order of merit, on the basis of Performa framed for this purpose. Separate list for Coaches and PETs will be prepared by the Screening Committee.
- (ii) The constitution of Screening Committee will be as follows: -
 - (a) Deputy Director of Education. (Sports) Chairman
 - (b) Deputy Director of Education (P.E.) Member
 - (c) Assistant Director of Education (Sports) Member

CRITERIA FOR MARKING / GRADATION : -

- (i) The assessment of the Coach and PET will be made on the basis of position achieve by his/her trainee in the last three years, in the following 5 categories :-
 - (a) Official World Championship, Olympic Games
 - (b) Official Asian Championship , Commonwealth Games, Asian Games, Commonwealth Championship.
 - (c) SAF Games
 - (d) Open National/International Championship.
 - (e) National School Games.

Achievement of the player has been categorizes as follows: -

- (d) For securing Gold Medal, Coach/PET will be allotted three marks.
- (e) For securing Silver Medal, Coach/PET will be allotted two marks.
- (f) For securing Bronze Medal, Coach/PET will be allotted one mark.

An outlay of Rs.15.00 lacs has been approved for 10th Five Year Plan and Rs.2.00 lacs is approved for Annual Plan 2002-03.

12. Scouts & Guides programmes in Govt. Schools

(Rs.75.00 lakhs for 10th Plan) (Rs.10.00 lakhs for Annual Plan 2002-03)

Objective of the scheme: -

1. To promote physical, mental and spiritual development of school scouts and guide.
2. To provide suitable environment for training of scouts and guide craft by play way method.
3. To generate awareness about discipline and good citizenship in Delhi school scouts and guide.

To provide opportunities and facilities for participation of poor talented boys and girls to take part in school guide championship at State/National/International level, facilities are provided to scouts and guide at Government level in states like U.P. , Harayana, Rajasthan and Maharashtra. Similar facilities are needed in Delhi also to groom students here.

Programme Contents

Under the scheme various activities programme an coaching camp at district state national and international competitions are to be organized.

- (i) Distt. level coaching camp.
- (ii) State level coaching camp.
- (iii) Participation in International level camp.
- (iv) Distt. and State level competition.
- (v) Participation in National level camp.
- (vi) State Rallies, Hikes, Jamborees and seminars.

An outlay of Rs.75.00 lakhs is approved for 10th Five Year Plan and Rs.10.00 lakhs for Annual Plan 2002-2003.

13. Development of Physical Education

(Rs. 75.00 lakhs for 10th Plan) (Rs.15.00 lakhs for Annual Plan 2002-03)

The objective/programme of this ongoing scheme are:-

1. Promotion of Physical Education.
2. Introduction and promotion of Physical Education as an elective subject at the Sr. Sec. level.
3. Integration of learning process and evaluation of students performance with academic ones.
4. Promotion by “Bhartiyam” Programme as physical culture.
5. Promotion of health Education and Health Services.
6. Training Programme or inservice teachers for growth of professional skill and competence.
7. Development of instructional material and teacher’s handbook.
8. Orientation programme for Inservice teachers.
9. Development of district and zonal team.
10. Development of infrastructure in schools, zones and distt.
11. Purchase of fitness material for H.Q., Distt. Training centers and schools.

Maximum emphasis will be given to the optimum use of infrastructure and trained teachers so as to achieve the role in the right direction as per aim and objective of the scheme. The procedure will be adopted in such a manner as to cover maximum number of students and teachers for imparting basic health education and physical fitness programme.

The following activities will be carried out under this scheme:-

1. Development of Zonal/District teams.
2. Improvement of infrastructure in schools.
3. Improvement of infrastructure at District and zonal level.
4. Development of institutional material and teaching aids.
5. Training programme in service teachers.

6. Orientation programme.
7. Bharitiyam programme.
8. Promotion of health education and health service.
9. Purchase of physical fitness material.
10. Inter School cultural competition No. of students.
11. Inter District competition.
12. State level competition.
13. Incentive training (Key personal).

Transportation

For proper supervision, inspection and timely availability of students at venue during the programme, it is essential to provide better and dependable transport facility. It is proposed to purchase one gypsy and one three wheeler.

An outlay of Rs. 75.00 lacs is approved for 10th Five Year Plan 2002-07 and Rs.15.00 lacs for Annual Plan 2002-2003.

II. Directorate of Higher Education

1. Promotion of Sports Facilities in University Colleges

(Rs.50.00 lakhs for 10th Plan) (Rs.10.00 lakhs for Annual Plan 2002-03)

There are more than 80 colleges affiliated with Delhi University. The sports facilities in some of these colleges are not up to the mark. The playgrounds are not in good shape and require immediate improvements and more amenities. Moreover, sports/games goods are not available in adequate quantities as every year, some of the old stock becomes unusable and fresh inputs are needed continuously. However, colleges often do not have funds for this purpose as sports and games are not given priority.

Keeping all this in view, it is proposed to give GIA to some colleges each year to upgrade their playgrounds and sports facilities. For this purpose, a provision of Rs.50.00 lacs for 10th Plan 2002-07 and Rs.10.00 lacs for Annual Plan 2002-03 is approved.

III. MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF DELHI

1. EXPANSIONS & IMPROVEMENT OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION (Rs.500.00 lakhs for 10th Plan) (Rs.70.00 lakhs for Annual Plan 2002-03)

OBJECTIVES

1. Physical Education is considered to be the integral part of overall development of students at all levels. Obviously the importance of physical education at primary school level cannot be underestimated because primary level is the feeder category for the national level and the international level of sportsmen.
2. In order to develop sportsman spirit, sound health, leadership qualities, team spirit, to flourish all round development of personality and to upgrade their tactical & technical skill of various games & sports, coaching camps for the students are organised and to motivate the young students, sports scholarships and also given by the department.
3. There is a separate wing of physical education in education department whose main objectives are as follows :
 - (a) To develop and maintain the infrastructure of play grounds in the schools, four mini stadiums, 56 physical centres, 4 swimming pools, 1 sports complex and 5 gymnasiums.
 - (b) To purchase sports material, Band equipment and sports/Band Uniforms for schools, gymnasiums, swimming pools, physical education centres etc.
 - (c) To provide guidance and run physical education programmes in schools and organise inter schools and inter zonal competitions in various games/sports and athletics.

- (d) To organise in services teachers training programmes to acquaint the teachers with latest development in the field of physical education and also to appraise them with the physical skills of various sports.
- (e) To plan and organise cultural activities like Independence Day, Annual Gandhi Mela, Bal Diwas, Basant Utsav, Cubs/Bulbul rallies at school level as well as at central level.
- (f) To plan and organise tours and educational excursions locally as well as outside namely Delhi Darshan and Bharat Darshan.
- (g) To organise the coaching camps for the children to enrich them in physical skills.

An outlay of Rs.500.00 lacs for 10th Five Year Plan and Rs.70.00 lacs is approved for Annual Plan 2002-03 to implement the scheme.

C/O Sports Complex cum Stadia

(Rs.1050.00 lakhs for 10th Plan) (Rs.30.00 lakhs for Annual Plan 2002-03)

Besides routine functions stated above, it is planned to construct three new mini stadium in next five year plan and also to renovate the existing stadiums and other sports infrastructure for which expenditure is likely to be incurred for purchase of sports equipment/material, payment of wages to the staff in newly planned sports infrastructure. Further with a view to provide effective supervision it is necessary to create minimum number of posts at supervisory level and to purchase of vehicle photocopier, computer and other equipment needed for administrative purpose of physical education wing.

The minimum anticipated posts during 2002-03 and 2002-07 are indicated below :-

An outlay of Rs. 1550.00 Lakhs for 10th Plan 2002-07 and Rs. 100.00 Lakhs for Annual plan 2002-03 is approved for both the plan schemes.

IV. NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC) DEPARTMENT

National Cadet Corps (NCC) is a premier youth organization of the country. It aims at developing leadership, character, sportsmanship and ideals of service. It also aims at creating a force of disciplined and trained manpower, which could be assets to the country. Keeping in view the games of NCC and their impact at the national level it is consider desirable that the maximum number of youth are induced to join this organisation.

The scheme wise details for the 10th Five Year Plan and Annual Plan 2002-03 are as under :-

1. Construction of NCC Bhavan

(Rs.940.00 lakhs for 10th Plan) (Rs.110.00 lakhs for Annual Plan 2002-03)

The scheme provide for construction of suitable accommodations to NCC group Headquarters 'B' and its nine units. Land measuring 6.79 acres was allotted by DDA at Rohini Complex. Cost of land and boundary wall etc. amounting to Rs.1,26,32,777/- has so far been paid to DDA.

The construction work has not yet been started by PWD, because of non approval of drawings of building by DDA, who have sent a demand of Rs.75,75,059/- -

For payment of this amount a proposal has been submitted to Finance Department, Government of NCT of Delhi, who in turn will put up the case before E.F.C After the payment of this amount PWD will be able to start construction. PWD have give AA & ES for Rs.9,82,37,300/- & time of four years.

Hence in order to achieve the target during the 10th Five Year Plan, a provision of Rs.940 lacs has been made for the 10th Five Year Plan & Rs.110.00 lacs for Annual Plan 2002-03.

2. Construction of Boat Houses & Jetties

(Rs.10.00 lakhs for 10th Plan) (Rs.10.00 lakhs for Annual Plan 2002-03)

It is again an ongoing scheme. During the 9th Five Year Plan, a sum of Rs.25 lacs was approved for construction of Boat House & Jetties.

During 9th Plan period, sanction for Rs.26.31 lacs was given towards construction of three rooms for keeping small boat, consumable boat spares and battery charge room, jetty & ramp, boundary wall, earth filling etc.

Now the PWD has given revised estimates to the Commanding Officer, 2 Delhi Naval Unit, NCC and demanded Rs.12 lacs for the construction of two additional rooms, internal road and storm water drain and three rooms for jetties and ramp at NCC Boat Pool Okhla.

An outlay of Rs.10.00 lacs has been provided for 10th Five Year Plan and the same amount for the Annual Plan 2002-03.

GENERAL ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT

PROMOTION OF SPORTS AND CULTURAL ACTIVITIES AMONG THE DELHI GOVT. EMPLOYEES.

(Rs.50.00 lacs for 10th Plan (Rs.10.00 lacs for Annual Plan 2002-03)

AIM AND OBJECTIVE OF THE SCHEME

To encourage, promote and control the athletics and control the Athletics and sports activities of the employees of Delhi Govt. To foster spirit of sportsmanship amongst the Delhi Govt. employees and provide them with an opportunity to meet in the field of sports and recreation. To institute and hold Delhi Govt. Championships, tournaments, Competitions, exhibition matches and sports meet. To affiliates and is to be affiliated with the various National sports Federation and other approved Institutions for the promotion of games and sports. To enter Delhi

Govt. Teams for participations in the All India Civil Services Tournaments and Competitions/Local tournaments/League matches from time to time. To promote and ensure amateurism amongst the Delhi Govt.'s teams and employees, to discover and encourage coaching classes/camps to improve the standards of sports of the Delhi Govt. employees. To encourage and promote fine arts like music, dance & drama amongst the Delhi Govt. employees working in various departments of Delhi Govt.

Need and Justification for the scheme

At present, there is no specific plan scheme for sports activities and cultural activities for Delhi. Employees. Thus, this will be very helpful sports and cultural activities among the Delhi Govt. employees.

Under the scheme the following programme are included:

- (1) (i) **Playing kit :** At present 14 sports teams are there in the Delhi Govt. and participating in All India Civil Services Tournament every year and local tournaments/league as per eligibility criteria & composition of teams of Central Civil Services Cultural and Sports Board, Ministry of Personnel Public Grievances & Pensions, Govt. of India. and period of duration thereof. Playing kits are issued to all the teams of Delhi Govt.
- (ii) In addition to the above, the Cultural/Music & Dance competitions are organized by the organizing state on behalf of Central Civil Services Cultural and Sports Board

3. Participation in local tournament/league tournament

At present five teams are affiliated with concerned Associations participating in the local tournaments and league etc. as per approved rates.

4. Affiliation fee

All the sports teams are affiliated each year with the concerned Association and affiliation fee is deposited.

5. Entry fee

The teams participating in local tournament and leagues, the entry fee are deposited as per the requirement of concerned tournament authority.

6. Organisation of All India Civil Services Tournament

General Administration Department of each state has the option to organize the A.I.C.S. tournament in either one or two sports event each year on behalf of Central Civil Services Cultural and Sports Board, Govt. of India which includes expenditure on Lodging and Boarding of the teams, transportation, referees fee, engagement of officials, prize distribution, trophies at the time of opening & closing ceremony.

7. Organisation of Inter Departmental Tournaments

Inter departmental tournaments are organized in various discipline by the G.A.D. every year which includes expenditure of engagement of referees/officials. It has also been in the proposal to distribute prizes in various events to the first three winning positions in the tournament i.e. Rs. 1000/- for the winner, Rs. 750/- for the first runner up and Rs. 500/- for the second runner up.

8. Organisation of Inter Secretariat Tournament

Inter secretariat tournament are also been proposed to be organized among the various departments located at the Delhi Secretariat building. The events to be organized are Table Tennis (Singles, Doubles, Mixed Doubles), Carom (Singles, Doubles), Chess (Singles) and Badminton (Singles, Doubles, Mixed Doubles). The prizes in various events shall also been proposed to be distributed i.e. Rs. 1000/- for the winner, Rs. 750/- for the first runner up and Rs. 500/- for the second runner up

Organisation of such tournaments will help Sports Cell, GAD to select the best players from the competitors who can represent Government of NCT of Delhi in the All India Civil Services Tournaments hosted by the different states. Selection of best players by this way will definitely help in improving the standards of the events.

9. Purchase of sports playing material

Sports playing materials are purchased for the existing 14 sports teams for practice and coaching camp and participation in various tournaments.

10. Incentive to the outstanding players

Incentives are also given to the best performers in the tournament in form of Cash/Blazed Memontos Trophies and Certificates.

11. Introduction of new scheme to provide Blue Blazers to the Manager/coach

It has been proposed to provide Blue Blazers (**putting the logo of Government of NCT of Delhi on its pocket**) to the Manager and coach accompanying the different teams of the Government of NCT of Delhi.

12. Facilities of a Gymnasium in the Delhi Secretariat

To provide the health activities amongst the staff working at Delhi Sectt., a Gymnasium has started functioning at 11th level in Delhi Sectt. w.e.f. 20th February, 2001. The Gym provides the following facilities:-

- i. Stationary bicycles
 - ii. Steppers/treaders
 - iii. Joggers
 - iv. Bench press with bar bell
 - v. Dubmbells
 - vi. 16 station multi-Gym
 - vii. Rowing machine
- a) The services of a professional Coach has also been provided at the Gym Centre to help the officers/officials in doing the exercise in right manner.
 - b) The services of a doctor has also been provided during the period of timings of Gym Centre for providing immediate medical facility in case of emergency/injury to any officer/official .
 - c) To avoid any theft of belongings of the officers/officials coming to exercise at Gym Centre, facility of lockers for storage of personal belonging during the exercise hours only has also been provided at Gym Centre.

It is first kind of physical facility provided to the Govt. employees in Delhi. A steam-cum-Sohna bath is also proposed to start at the Gym Centre. Providing the same at Gym Centre shall be made in consultation with PWD.

14. Facility to play indoor games at Multipurpose/recreation Hall

A multipurpose/recreation hall has been set up for practice of table tennis, carom and chess by the selected probable teams of Govt. of NCT of Delhi. The facility to play indoor games like Badminton, table tennis, carom and chess has also been extended for the officers/officials working at Delhi Secretariat after office hours.

The efforts are being made by the Sports Cell at Delhi Sectt. to infuse the sportsmanship amongst the staff working at Delhi Sectt. as well as to provide them the basic requirement for physical fitness and best health within the office premises.

An outlay of Rs.50.000 lacs has been approved for 10th Five Year Plan and Rs.10.00 lacs has been provided for Annual Plan 2002-03 to implement the Scheme.
